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What are the procedures for obtaining reimbursement for care services ?

For nationals of the European Union + Switzerland, Lichtenchten, Iceland, and Norway

You have to apply for the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) from your social protection institution in your country of residence. The European Health Insurance Card allows partial reimbursement of medical expenses.

If it is not possible to obtain the card before your departure, it is possible to register with the French Social Security upon presentation of the «S1 form» which you should collect from your social protection organisation.

The EHIC does not guarantee free of charge! Some will remain at your expense, and can be high, particularly in the event of hospitalisation, for example.

You can take out supplementary (mutual) insurance to cover the remaining costs.



For non-European citizens

It is necessary to register with the Social Security. This is done online. Registration is free and compulsory.

1. Create your account on the [Ameli website](#) and send the necessary documents.
2. You will receive a provisional social security number. Don't forget to download your certificate!
3. A definitive social security number will be sent to you. Then log on to the [Ameli website](#). This account will give you access to all the services related to Social Security.
4. Fill in the form to obtain your carte vitale. This card will allow you to be reimbursed automatically. Please note: some doctors do not accept the carte vitale. They will give you a «care sheet» that you will have to fill in and send to the Caisse primaire d'assurance maladie (CPAM).



What is a health mutuelle ? Is it mandatory ?

Social Security does not reimburse all medical expenses. Some care can be very expensive, and supplementary insurance helps to pay for what Social Security does not cover. It is paid for and optional.

How to make an appointment ?

The [Doctolib website](#) allows you to find a doctor (of any speciality) and make an appointment with one. Doctors can indicate the languages they speak, which can be useful if you prefer to speak in a language other than French.

The website allows you to make an appointment at the practice, and also offers an online option.

You need to create an account to be able to make an appointment. It's free.



Doctors may apply different fees that the student must take into account. A doctor who is «conventionné» applies a fixed rate (consultation for a general practitioner: 25 euros).



A doctor who is «non conventionné» is not covered by the agreement between his profession and the health insurance funds and is free to set his own fees. To ensure that your consultation is reimbursed, make sure that the doctor is «conventionné secteur 1».

Where to get medical attention ? Some useful addresses

Service inter-universitaire de médecine préventive et de promotion de la santé

The SIUMPPS is a health centre dedicated to students. The teams there are multidisciplinary: nurses, general practitioners, psychologists. It is possible, for example, to have examinations, get vaccinations or obtain a medical certificate.
